Dr. Resch will present information on what we should be doing in our practices to comply with OSHA regulations and CDC recommendations for our profession. Time will also be spent on how to best comply and keep our staff and patients safe. The presentation goes over what is old, what is new, and what is old with a new "twist" when it comes to infection control and OSHA regulations in dentistry in the 21st century.

Since the early 1990's Dr. Resch has trained Minnesota private and group practices in OSHA regulations and infection control in dentistry, presented at the Star of the North meeting and lectured for the U of M School of Dentistry. He is presently co-chair of the MDA's Environment and Safety Committee and is an active member in The Organization for Safety & Asepsis Procedures (OSAP). OSAP is an organization which promotes science-based

policies and practices for infection control, health, and safety in dental healthcare settings worldwide. His almost 30 years in the field of dentistry and the last 17 being intimately involved in all facets of infection control and OSHA regulations have given him an education and insight that many others may not have experienced.
